Life Coach Expectations

1. Read and affirm our Statement of Faith and give your corresponding signature
2. Obtain two letters of recommendation: your Pastor and a friend or co-worker
3. Schedule an interview with two of our Board members to help you become more familiar with the Mission House and our vision

A Life Coach will mentor, resident, and help them develop a life plan for their resident. This is an individual one-on-one relationship. You will need to devote ample time to build this relationship because we not only offer our residents Christ, but we offer them ourselves.

Life Coach Expectations

Introduce them to Jesus, your Savior and Lord. We want them to encounter the Lord in a new way filled with hope and love. We believe that real change starts on the inside. We are not really interested in temporary cosmetic changes in our residents but a heart change, believing it is the power of God that can break the chains that have kept them in bondage.

Pray often for your resident. Ask about his struggles. Celebrate what God is doing in his life with him.

Meet weekly (at any location) with your new resident to go over and evaluate their weekly activity sheet that we provide. This will include Church activities, Bible studies, volunteer activities, work schedules, and their accountability or community groups (Promise Keepers, Celebrate Recovery, Overcomers, AA, etc.)

Make a contact with your resident during the week in an effort to build a relationship with him. Try to encourage him frequently.

Most of these men grew up in a dysfunctional home with little support and encouragement. Many of their lives were ravished by drugs and alcohol. Our prayer is that God would use you as an instrument of His grace so you might join in their healing process.

We do not expect you to meet with more than one individual, but we do expect you to stay with him until he graduates from our program. The normal program duration lasts six months. However, this does not stop you from continuing your relationship after he leaves the Mission House

We will trust the wisdom of our Life Coaches as we evaluate the resident's length of stay at the Mission House. If the Life Coach finds it beneficial to extend the resident's stay with us, then we will likely honor that request as long as the resident is making progress with their life plan.

It is permissible for you to involve your resident in your personal ministry activities (your Church, Family night suppers etc.) If at any time you are alarmed by something harmful you hear and think it is beneficial for us to know this information, please contact our director at director@crossroadsmoultrie.com.
